



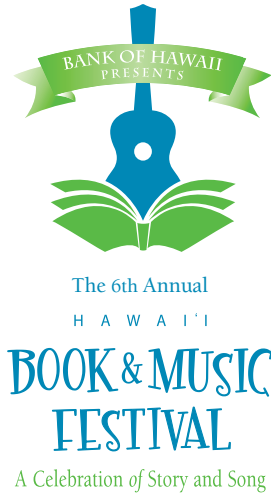

Add some terrific local and national keiki and adult authors, Shari Lynn's Chorus Showcase, an extraordinary panel program, about "The Value of Hawaii: Shaping the Future," and fascinating news coming from our Hawaiian Alana culture program, and you have a festival to treasure and remember.
